Barbara Louise Voorhees, 73, of Grand Island passed away on Monday, April 27, 2020. There will be a private celebration of life service held at 1:00 p.m. Thursday, April 30, at All Faiths Funeral Home. Barbara was born December 7, 1946 in El Paso, Texas, the daughter of Wiley and Willie Mae (Nunley) Shoemaker. She graduated from Sanderson High School, Texas, in 1965 before attending Durham Business College in San Antonio, graduating in 1966. Barbara was employed with Texas Pharmacal Company.

On July 14, 1967, Barbara was united in marriage to Donald Voorhees in Sanderson, TX, following his discharge from the United States Army. They soon relocated to Omaha where they made their home for the next 40 plus years. They were blessed with one son, Jeffrey Douglas Voorhees. The couple moved to Grand Island in 2016.
