Alfred E. Nability, 86 of Grand Island died Tuesday, April 5, 2016 at Good Samaritan Society-Hastings Village.

Mass of Christian Burial will be 10 a.m. Saturday at St. Leo's Catholic Church. Father Donald Buhrman will be the Celebrant. Burial will be in the Westlawn Memorial Park Cemetery.
