Audrey enjoyed cooking and many people have been loved by the cooking she did for them. Not only family, but Audrey also cooked for the Giltner Schools for 3 years. Then she went on to be a nursing aid at the VA home in Grand Island for 20 years. After her time at the VA, she did private care for elderly in their homes. And then with retirement, Audrey was again found cooking for family. She enjoyed trying new recipes, especially cookie recipes. No one left their home without sharing coffee and cookies.
