Berniece L. Dixon, 99 of Grand Island died on Monday, April 4, 2016 at Golden Living -Park Place.

Berniece was born on July 12, 1916 to Levi H. and Dora (Brokaw) Jensen near Creighton, NE.

They made their home in Grand Island until his passing in 1989. In September 1994 Berniece married W. Clay Dixon. They remained in Grand Island until his passing in 1999.

Berniece was a lifelong member of the Methodist faith. She was first a member at Royal and then transferred to Grand Island, where she was a member at the time of her death. She was very active in the church circle as well as the Women's Club, the Rebekah Lodge for over 50 years and the Circle of the Lodge.

In her working years, she was employed by Robert Dairy for six years, in accounting, until the plant closed in Grand Island. For the next 20 years she was employed by Kriz-Davis Co.

For a number of years after retirement she volunteered at both St. Francis Skilled Care and Lake View Nursing Home.

Berniece was a gifted with a needle, making many beautiful embroidery pieces. She collected bears and was an avid reader.
