Byron James Fulton, 85 of Cairo died Friday, February 21, 2014 at his home. Services will be 11 a.m. Wednesday, February 26th at Resurrection Catholic Church. Father Michael F. McDermott will officiate. Burial of ashes will be in the Westlawn Memorial Park Cemetery.

To honor Mr. Fulton's wishes cremation will take place with no visitation. All Faiths Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.

Mr. Fulton was born July 14, 1928 in Guide Rock to William "Jim" and Dorette (Crow) Fulton.

He married Marlice Hargens of Cairo on June 3, 1977 at Resurrection Catholic Church. They continued to make their home in Cairo.

Some of his enjoyments included camping, fishing, playing cards, gardening and taking care of his dogs. His favorite pastime was going to grandchildren activities. He was a member of Resurrection Catholic Church.
