Carl "Elmer" Edberg, 91, of Grand Island died Monday, November 10, 2014 at Grand Island Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

Elmer was born November 1, 1923 in Palmer, Massachusetts, to Melker and Edna (Johnson) Edberg.

He is survived by his brother, Paul Edberg of Three Rivers, Massachusetts and was preceded in death by his parents and an infant sister.

Elmer grew up in Palmer, graduating from Palmer High School. He entered the United States Navy on May 28, 1943, serving in the Pacific Theater. He was honorably discharged February 18, 1946. He moved to Grand Island in 1953.

Elmer was united in marriage to Agnes Cudaback and this marriage blessed him with stepchildren, step grandchildren and step great-grandchildren. He was employed at the Ordinance Plant and then at the Grand Island Post Office for 22 years.

A skilled trumpeter, Elmer played with numerous bands during the big band era.
