Carolyn Nahorny, age 100, originally of Grand Island, passed away on Wednesday, February 18, 2026.

Carolyn was an avid golfer. She and her husband were members of several golf clubs over the years. She received the League Champion Award with her partner, Trudie Franke, in 1982, 1988, 1991, 1992 and 1993 which hangs at Jackrabbit Run Golf Course of Grand Island. As a member of the Grand Island Ladies Golf Association, she was also awarded the Club Champion Award in 1980 and 1984.

She is survived by her children, Michael (Jean) Nahorny and Sandy Kelly; five grandchildren, Chris (Erin) Nahorny, Cory (Kim) Nahorny, Tony Nahorny, Tim Kelly and Ted Kelly; and several great-grandchildren.
