Charles 'Charlie' 'Chuck' Robertson, 92, of Doniphan, passed away on March 26, 2026, at Grand Island Regional Medical Center, with his loving family by his side. A funeral service will be held on Wednesday, April 1 at 11 am at the Doniphan United Methodist Church, family will greet friends one hour prior to the service. Pastor Scott Evans will officiate. A private family burial, with military honors, will take place at the Cedarview Cemetery following the luncheon. All Faiths Funeral Home is entrusted with the arrangements.

Charles was born on February 9, 1934, in Maywood, NE., to James and Anna (Wattles) Robertson. Charles graduated from Maxwell High School in 1952. After graduation, Charles enlisted in the United States Army, where he proudly served our country until his honorable discharge in 1958. He often told the story of seeing Elvis Presley arrive at the Army Base he served at in Germany. On September 12, 1965, Charles was united in marriage to Connie Cruff. The couple first made their home in Grand Island, until they moved to Doniphan in 1976. For 30 years, Charles was a trooper for the Nebraska State Patrol retiring in 1990. During his career he received numerous awards, to include trooper of the year!

Charles was a member of the Doniphan United Methodist Church. In his spare time, he enjoyed fishing, hunting, gardening, and woodworking. He was featured in the Grand Island Independent show casing his handmade wooden replicas of construction equipment and a variety of tractors. His greatest joy in life was attending his grandchildren's activities, and spending time with his

family. For the last five months he was a resident at Lebensraum Assistant Living, where he found joy in card games, activities, and the companionship of those around him.

Those left to cherish his memory include his wife, Connie; children, DeAnn (Trent) Kleier, Pamela Schroeder; grandchildren, Nolan (Jenna) Kleier; Madilyn (Zach) Christensen; Chloe (Tyler) Townsend, Cecilia Schroeder; great grandchildren, Breckenn, Conner, Peyton and Ella, and many extended family members.

Charles was preceded in death by his parents; siblings, Betty Werkmeister, Warren Robertson, Donna Arnold, and an infant sister.

“ Charlie Robertson-NSP badge 207. One of the warmest, nicest person’s ever. When I came on the NSP in 1988, 5 of us came to Grand Island as new troops. Charlie was one of the many veteran troops who would be a Field Training Officer for some of us. He was never my FTO but a story many remember was during this time he was FTO’ing new trooper Duis. They were being called to assist in an I-80 high speed pursuit of a seriously dangerous suspect. Charlie was probably 55 years or so old in age and was within a year of being able to retire. His Patrol car at that time was a 5-speed Ford Mustang. Maybe a 1987 or 1988 year model. Charlie was an excellent driver and during this pursuit he was able to within seconds tell the new trooper he was going to pull in the median incredibly fast but come to a quick immediate stop so the new troop Duis needed to jump out with the shotgun and shoot the tire of the fleeing vehicle to disable it so the pursuit could end. Charlie did this maneuver perfectly and the tire was disabled by the rookie Duis and the suspect gave up to be arrested. Charlie was a trooper known to ALWAYS wear his campaign trooper hat. Always- he wore it. And the place he wore it so often was IN the patrol car while patrolling. OLD SCHOOL NSP-Charlie was. He and Connie would always attend functions the Patrol had or our association the State Troopers Association of Nebraska would hold. Picnics, Christmas parties, retirements for fellow troopers. I literally only got to work with Charlie for one year before he retired but will always remember him. He will be missed.
