Charlotte F. Brown, 81 of Grand Island died Monday, December 4, 2017 at CHI Health St. Francis.

Celebration of life service will be 11 a.m. Friday, December 15th at the First Presbyterian Church. Reverend Caroline Price-Gibson will officiate.

Entombment of ashes will be in the church's columbarium.

A gathering of friends and family will be from 5-7 p.m. Thursday, December 14th at All Faiths Funeral Home.

Charlotte was born October 1, 1936 at Omaha the daughter of Raymond and Ferne (Groves) Stanley.

Charlotte was raised in the south Omaha area. She attended Omaha South High School and then was in the first graduating class of Ralston High School in 1954. In 1958 she received her bachelors of education from the University

of Omaha.

On June 14, 1958 she was united in marriage to Lloyd Brown at Ralston Community Church. They lived in Omaha where she briefly taught 1st grade before starting her family. A move to Grand Island in 1970 occurred when Lloyd and his two partners started Nebraska Truck Center Inc.

Charlotte was a loving daughter, sister, wife, mother and grandmother who cherished her time enjoying many family functions including fishing, golf, vacations, holiday gatherings, and attending many performances and activities by her children and grandchildren. In addition to her devotion to family, she and Lloyd were avid Husker Sports fans, enjoying both football and volleyball, and attending both home and away football games since the 1970's. Some of Charlotte's involvements included: Girl Scouts: volunteering both locally and nationally, serving as Goldenrod Girl Scout Council Board President, and as Brownies-Juniors-Cadets and Seniors leader; Stuhr Museum: she was a Docent teaching summer school classes and a guide for school trips; Church: she taught preschool at Ralston Community Church; she was very involved at First Presbyterian Church, directing the hand bell choir, teaching bible school, sang in the choir, and was the preschool coordinator. Other involvements were: member of GI Chapter of PEO Sisterhood International; Volunteer Aides in Reading (VAIR)-Grand Island Public Schools; PTA President and other school volunteering; sang in Grand Island Mothers Singers; Crane Meadows volunteer; member of the Bookless Book Club; Newcomers; bowling league and golf league; and she also cofounded the GI Parkinson's Support Group with Connie Van Wie. Her honors included: recipient of the Service to Mankind Award by Third City Sertoma; Mrs. Nebraska Motor Carrier of 1977; honorary member of the Program Agency of the United Presbyterian Church-USA; honorary State Life Membership in the NE Congress of Parents and Teachers.
