“ Gene was my very best friend during our elementary school years in Elmira, NY. We were practically inseparable. I loved Gene. Although I had my own brother, I considered Gene as my second brother. I first met Gene when his sister Alyssia introduced us when my family moved next door in the summer of 1967. It was at the side of my house on Walnut st riding my bike when she brought him over. From there on out the strong bond and connection began. Between 1967 until the time Gene and his family moved to Florida in 1973, we spent nearly everyday day together.

We spent most of the summers on the Chemung river fishing and rafting since we lived next to the river at Water and Walnut St in Elmira. We were the modern day Huck Finn(Gene) and Tom Sawyer(myself). One of the most memorable moments was rafting. Before we bought our inflatable rafts using our parents S&H green stamps, we built a raft using spare lumber from his Dads scrape lumber pile. Then Gene being the young entrepreneur decided to use his mother's old dinette set that she planned to sell, to attach to the raft and charge neighborhood kids for a dining river tours. After several successful tours making the beginings of our fortune the raft started to come apart and we lost the set. Fortunately no customers wete on the raft and we made it to shore only to be grounded for several weeks because of the dinette set!

When we weren't on the river we were playing baseball, both little league and sand lot pickup games with the neighborhood. We had the dream of becoming the the next Cy Young(myself) and Johnny Bench(Gene). Over time, Gene had acquired a complete catchers outfit. We'd spend hours pitching and catching. I ended up with one heck of a curve ball thanks to Gene's persistence on practicing! Another example of Gene's creativity and imagination is the building of a bicycle race track on an old empty lot next to his house. We would race other kids, but in end at the final laps it was Gene and I going neck and neck just like Earnhardt and Jeff Gordon. Then in June 1972 tropical storm Agnes changed our lives forever. Gene's parents home on Walnut st next to river was condemned due to severe flood damage. Early the following year March of 1973 was that last time Gene and I saw each other. His family relocated

to New Port Richey , FL. He came to visit at my house and I remember to this day his moms station wagon pulling away out of sight. Although I had plans to visit him in Florida we went our seperate ways. I became involved an Football and wrestling in my high school years which took up all my spare time.

Then in 2017 with the power of social media we reconnected. The strange crazy thing about it is the bond was still there strong after all those years. After retiring earlier this year I was planning on visiting Gene this coming summer in NE. Unfortunately Gene is now gone, so we won't get that opportunity. I waited too long! But I know someday I will see him again. Until then Rest in Peace my dear friend. Rest in Peace

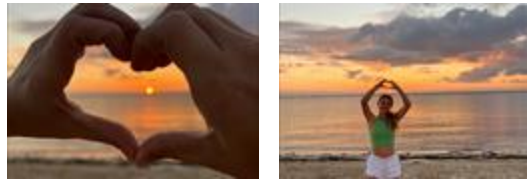

We decided to boogey out of there to avoid being trapped and proceeded to ride just over 7 hours in about 40 degree weather with rain luring down. We had to stop about every 50-75 miles or so and warm up at random gas stations. At the time, it was more miserable than basic training was, it looking back at it now, I wouldn’t trade it for anything. We bonded, burned, laughed, had an amazing trip.

I will never forget you and the impacts you had on me, it most importantly, my kids (your grandkids).
