Gene Paul Lawrey, 83, of Grand Island died on Sunday, January 22, 2017 at CHI Health St. Francis Medical Center.

Memorial service will be held at 10:00 a.m. Friday at All Faiths Funeral Home with military honors provided by the United States Army and Grand Island Veterans Honor Guard. Reverend Daniel Bremer will officiate. Burial of ashes will be in Grand Island City Cemetery.

Gene was born July 19, 1933 in Grand Island to John and Bertha (Pohl) Lawrey. He grew up in Grand Island, graduating from Grand Island Senior High School, class of 1951.

He was united in marriage to Rachel Onken on September 7, 1952.

Gene entered the United States Army on August 18, 1954 serving during the Korean War and was stationed in Hawaii as Communications Chief in the 21st Antiaircraft AW Battalion. He was honorably discharged on October 25, 1958.

Gene made a career as a fireman with the City of Grand Island for 21 years, retiring in 1980. He then worked as a carpenter and was employed by Walmart, retiring for the second time in 2009.

Gene was baptized in the Lutheran faith, and also attended Assembly of God.

He is survived by son, Kevin (Linda) Lawrey of Ft. Morgan, CO; daughters, Tami (Rodney) Fiedler of Grand Island and Traci (Bryan) Raber of Cedar Rapids, IA; brother, William (Sandy) Lawrey of Grand Island; eight grandchildren, Jeremy (Dawn) Lawrey, Joshua Fiedler, Sarah (Johnathan) Bollefer, Nichole (Matthew) Dalrymple, Ashley (Joshua) Dalland, Ricky Raber,

Amanda Raber and Erik Raber; and eleven great-grandchildren.
He was preceded in death by his parents and sister, Roberta Lawrey.
