George A. Newcomb Jr., 75, of Grand Island passed away unexpectedly on July 26, 2024.

Memorial services in his honor will be held at 10:30 a.m. on Thursday, August 1, 2024 at All Faiths Funeral Home. Military honors will be rendered by the U.S. Air Force and Veteran's Honor Guard. Dan Naranjo will officiate. Private family burial will take place at a later date at Cambridge Cemetery. Memorials are suggested to the family for future designation.

George was born January 1, 1949 in Lexington, NE, only son of George and Roberta (Taylor) Newcomb. George grew up in Curtis where he attended Medicine Valley Schools until his junior year when his family relocated to Aurora where he graduated from Aurora High School. Before continuing his education, George enlisted in the United States Air Force on March 12, 1969. He was stationed in Turkey and Japan and was received his honorable discharge on January 31, 1973. In 1976, George graduated from the University of Nebraska at Kearney with his degree in elementary education and special education. He earned his master's degree in school administration.

On December 28, 1974, George was married to Karen Olsen, mother of Amber and Kim, for 19 years. He was greatly loved by her family

George will be missed by me in particular because in the fall he and I would constantly text each other on Saturdays about our college favorite college football teams (the Gophers and the his Huskers). Neither one of us thought they were worth a damn.
