James "Jim" W. Lilienthal, 73, of Grand Island, passed away with his family by his side on Tuesday, August 8, 2017 at the Veteran's Affairs Medical Center. To honor Jim's wishes, cremation was chosen. Celebration of Life services will be at 11 a.m. on Saturday at All Faiths Funeral Home. Dan Naranjo will officiate. A time of gathering will be an hour prior. Military honors will be rendered by United Veterans Honor Guard and U.S. Air Force Honor Guard. Private family burial of ashes will take place at a later date at Grand Island City Cemetery.

Jim was born on August 18, 1943 in Grand Island, son of Roy and Elsie (Luth) Lilienthal.
