Joy M. Beazley 87, of Grand Island went to his Heavenly home on Thursday, January 14, 2021 with his loving family at his side following a lengthy battle with cancer.

Joy was born on August 27, 1933 the son of Arlo S. and Roma (Smith) Beazley in Washta, Iowa. He grew up on a farm southwest of Washta attending and graduating from Washta High School class of 1951. Joy served in the U.S. Army from 1953 until 1954. He attended Kearney State College for a year and a half.

On June 9, 1957 he was united in marriage to Marietta Mason at Kearney. They lived most of their married life in Grand Island. Joy was employed by the

Retail Credit Company in 1957 and in 1972 went to work for Equitable Building and Loan Association. He retired as a Vice President in 1999. Following retirement, he continued to work for the family business at GI Loan Shop.

Memberships included Trinity United Methodist Church, the American Legion, VFW, Liederkrantz and the Grand Island Coin Club. He loved animals especially feeding the squirrels and loved visiting with others.

His memory will be treasured by his wife of 63 years, Marietta; son, Darlo (Pat) Beazley of Dannebrog; daughter, Anita Marie (Dan) Davis of Grand Island; grandchildren, Jon Beazley, Jill Simons, Abby Kluna, Dan Davis Jr. and Taylor Davis and great grandchildren Alexis, Keirsyn, Presley, Kolten, Beau, Deagan, Hudson, Rollie and Remi.
