She liked to stay busy and spent her free time socializing with friends, traveling, sewing, gardening, antiquing, repurposing furniture, and numerous other craft projects. One of her favorite pastimes was rug hooking. Merlene also enjoyed playing piano, and shopping. But most important to Merlene was her family. She always loved to travel back to the farm where she grew up. Merlene enjoyed a very rich spiritual life and was especially happy to have been able to make a trip to the Holy Land.
