Michael Allen "Mike" Vanicek, 65, of Grand Island passed away on Tuesday, January 19, 2021, after a five-month battle with brain cancer.

Celebration of life memorial service will be 11:00 a.m. Friday at Peace Lutheran Church with Rev. Luke Biggs officiating. Livestreaming of the service will be available on All Faiths Facebook Page. Burial of ashes will be at 1:30 p.m. at Greenwood Cemetery in York, NE.

There will be a gathering of friends and family for the hour prior to the service beginning at 10. All Faiths Funeral Home is entrusted with arrangements.

Mike was born December 21, 1955, at Schuyler, NE, the son of LeRoy and Ardeth (Kral) Vanicek. He attended school in Schuyler, Lexington and York, graduating from York High School in 1974. Mike then attended UNL, receiving a degree in business in 1978.

On July 14, 1979, Mike married his high school sweetheart, Rhonda Rathje. The couple made their home in Lincoln for two years before moving to Grand Island.

Mike was employed by Commercial Federal Savings and Loan for three years, Overland National Bank for 16 years and had 15 years with Bosselman Energy as Credit Manager, before retiring in 2017.

He was a member of Peace Lutheran Church and his faith helped keep him strong through his cancer. Mike coached Little League baseball for over 20 years. He also enjoyed golf and spending time at the lake house at Summer Haven by Fort Kearny.

Those who cherish Mike's memory include his wife, Rhonda; son, Brady Vanicek and fiancée, MaryLynn Erickson of Hastings; father, LeRoy (Kathy) Vanicek of Arizona; twin brother, Mark (Nancy) Vanicek of Lincoln, Joel (Laurie) Vanicek of Omaha and Gary Vanicek of Illinois.

Other survivors include mother-in-law, Donna Rathje of York; brothers and sisters-in-law, Wes and Robin Handley of Oklahoma, Arnie and Peggy Johnson of Albion and Rose Rathje of Hastings; step-brother, Curt Buchanan of Arizona and step-sister, Pam Dierking of Kansas; and many nieces and nephews.

He was preceded in death by his daughter, Kaila Vanicek; mother, Ardeth Vanicek; father-in-law, Harry Rathje and brother-in-law, Scott Rathje.
