



Naomi Olympia (Cox) Seeman

Naomi O. (Cox) Seeman, 57, of Grand Island, passed away Tuesday, September 22, 2015 in Lakewood, CO at St. Antony's Hospital.

A Celebration of Life Service will be held 1:00 p.m. Saturday, October 10 at All Faiths Funeral Home for her family and friends.

She is survived by her husband of 25 years, Terry; sons, Duncan MacDonald of Orange Park, Fla and Jason (Megan) Seeman of Nashville, TN; daughters, Claire (Doyle) Clark of Cheyenne, WY and Melinda (Mike) Cherry of Palm Coast, Fla; grandchildren, Rex, Aeriella, Max, Jayden, and Bella; mother, Gloria Cox of Orange Park, Fla; father-in-law, Herbert Seeman of Oberlin, KS; brothers, Maynard 'Bud' (Melody) Cox, Walter (Anna) Cox, and Phillip (Michelle) Cox all of Orange Park, Fla; sisters, Paula Popp of New Mexico and Marlynne Cox of Michigan; sister-in-law, Tenna (Kent) Ashley of Selden, KS and several nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her father, Maynard 'Snakeman' Cox and mother-in-law Shirley Seeman.

Naomi was born April 14, 1958, in Seattle, Washington to Maynard and Gloria (Baer) Cox. Raised in a United States Navy family, Naomi lived in several places throughout her childhood. She lived in California, Hawaii, Philippines

and Florida. She was active in girl scouts, the military swim team, as a life guard and a dive instructor. She was also a majorette for the Oakland Raiders half time show for several years and in 1965 she marched the Rose Bowl parade as a majorette. The family eventually homesteaded in Orange Park, Florida when she was in the 6th grade where she attended Clay County Public Schools. Naomi was in NJROTC for four years while attending Orange Park High School, from where she graduated in 1976. She then attended Nursing School, while attending college she was a JANGO (candy striper) for NAS JAX Hospital. During her nursing career she was assigned to POW John McCain, to help process him back into the States when he returned from The Vietnam War.

On April 14, 1990, Naomi was united in marriage to Terry Seeman in Orange Park, where they made their home until 2002 when they moved to Nebraska. Their blended family included four children, Duncan, Claire, Jason and Melinda, and they were blessed with five grandchildren. Naomi was a daughter, sister, wife, mother, grandmother and aunt to her family.

Naomi worked in the medical field her entire life as a nurse, billing/coding, administration, and CEO. She eventually medically retired in 2002. She enjoyed her family and friends the most. Naomi loved visiting her children and grandchildren. The grandkids always knew she was coming with neat treats for them. She had a contagious smile, a bubbly personality, loved meeting people, and she never knew a stranger. Once you met Naomi she was a friend forever.
