Mrs. Beyersdorf was born June 17, 1932 at Detroit, Michigan the daughter of Victor and Anne (Springer) Nobeck.

Her nursing career started in high school as a Candy Striper. Later she served as head of nursing for the Doctors Hospital in Omaha, then head of nursing at Orchard Hill Nursing Home in Omaha. She worked for the American Red Cross Blood Mobile in Omaha from 1965 until her retirement in

1978 and continued to volunteer until 1984.

Patricia was united in marriage to Jim Killion in 1955. To this union they were blessed with children, John, Colleen and Lynne.

Later she married Charles E. Beyersdorf in 1966. While her husband Charles was stationed in Japan where they lived, Pat helped organize Christmas in July for the Vietnam War wounded soldiers. This project was assisted through Dear Abby and Ann Landers. She also volunteered at hospitals in Japan during the war. In 1987 Charles and Pat moved to Grand Island from Omaha. As a single parent Pat was a foster parent. When her children were young she served as a Cub Scout Den Mother and later volunteered for the Navy Mothers. Following her accident in 1984 which left her disabled she continued to volunteer at St. Pauls Lutheran Church in Grand Island. Pat never complained and always continued helping others.
