Robert "Bob" Dubas, 71, of Grand Island passed away following a short illness with pancreatic cancer on January 31, 2022.

He attended Fullerton Catholic Elementary School, Fullerton High School and University of Nebraska in Lincoln.

Bob enlisted in the United States Air Force. He was stationed as an air traffic controller at Whiteman Air Force Base in Missouri from 1970-1974.

On October 10, 1970, Bob and Mona (Schutt) were married in Grand Island. They were blessed with two children. Bob made it his priority to put his family first. Any of the kids or grandkids activities were his favorite. Bob could be found at any event to show his love and support. His family was the joy of his life.

Following Bob's military service, they moved back to Grand Island where he farmed part time and worked as an air traffic controller at the Grand Island airport for the Federal Aviation Administration. Then Bob attended CCC in Hastings and earned a degree in data processing in January 1984.

Bob always loved the farm-life and started farming part time in 1979. He went full time in 1980 and continued his passion until his death. Through farming, Bob made the best friends.

Bob was on the Northwest School Board from 1992 until 2004. He was also a member of the Saddle Club, American Legion and YMCA.
