Ronald E. "Ron" Trampe, 75, of Grand Island passed away on Wednesday, December 29, 2021.

Service and celebration of Ron's life will be held at 10:30 a.m. Friday, January 7th, at All Faiths Funeral Home. Burial will follow at Westlawn Memorial Park Cemetery.
