



Dr. Sheridan T. Anderson

August 8, 1938 - July 29, 2016

Dr. Sheridan T. Anderson, 77, of Grand Island died on Friday, July 29, 2016.

To honor his wishes there will be no service, burial will be in the Ft.

McPherson National Cemetery.

Sheridan was born on August 8, 1938 in Omaha, son of Dr. John and Dorothy (Jones) Anderson.

Those left to cherish his memory include his wife, Mary Jane “Janie” Anderson; brothers, Dr. Robert (Dr. Kathy) Anderson of Hastings, Jim Anderson of Hastings, Paul Anderson of Grand Island; nephews, Mark, Neil, and Alec; mother-in-law, Betty J. Hill of Grand Island; sister-in-law, Connie R. McKay of Newark, DE; along with numerous extended family and friends.

He is preceded in death by his father, Dr. John S. Anderson, mother, Dorothy Anderson, father-in-law, Bud Hill, brother-in-law, Joe Ferranto.

Sheridan graduated with the Grand Island High School class of 1956. He continued his education graduating in 1966 from the University of Nebraska Medical Center. He was united in marriage to Ruth Ann Glass on June 19, 1964 in Grand Island.

He entered the United States Air Force on July 6, 1967 serving during the Vietnam War. Sheridan was stationed at the Kessler AFB in Biloxi, MS until his honorable discharge on July 7, 1972.

Upon returning to Grand Island, Sheridan went into practice with his father, Dr. John S. Anderson until his father retired in 1988. From 1988 to 2006, Sheridan enjoyed serving the Veteran’s at the Grand Island Veteran’s Home,

and also was the track doctor at Fonner Park for several seasons.

On December 12, 1997 he married Mary Jane “Janie” Hill in Las Vegas, NV.

Sheridan was a member of the Saddle Club and Platt Duetsche.
