Steve C. Luebbe, 69 of Grand Island formerly of Holdrege, died Monday, December 18, 2017 at Good Samaritan Society-Grand Island Village following a long battle with cancer.

Celebration of life service will be Friday, January 5, 2018 at 10:30 a.m. in the chapel of All Faiths Funeral Home, Grand Island. Reverend Kenton Birtell from Mount Calvary Lutheran Church in Holdrege will officiate. Burial of ashes will be in the Westlawn Memorial Park Cemetery.

Steve was born December 4, 1948 at Grand Island the son of Art and Ruby (Thesenvitz) Luebbe. He was raised on a farm near Worms and graduated from Palmer High School class of 1967. Later in life he received his business degree from Kearney State College.

On May 3, 1975 he was united in marriage to Mary Buhrman. They lived in Holdrege for 42 years. Steve worked as an accountant for Becton-Dickinson in Holdrege retiring after 36 years of service. Following his retirement Steve pursued his passion and became a cattle-buyer. He was a cattle-buyer for over 14 years. They moved to Grand Island in September 2016.

Survivors include his wife, Mary; sons, Todd (Jennifer) Luebbe of Nashville, TN and Brian (Katie) Curry of Westminster, CO; grandchildren, Langston Luebbe, Adalynn Luebbe and Alyssa Curry and sister, Marcia (John) Campbell of Lincoln.

He was preceded in death by his parents.


