



## Thomas "Tuck" Moroney

July 31, 1932 - July 30, 2021

Thomas "Tuck" E. Moroney, 89, of Grand Island passed away on July 30, 2021 at Grand Island Regional Hospital.

Visitation will be held from 4 to 6 pm on Thursday, August 5 at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church. The Vigil service will be held at 6 p.m.

Mass of Christian Burial will be held at 1 p.m. on Friday, August 6 at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church. Celebrants will be Fr. Marty Egging and Fr. Mark Maresh. Burial to follow at Westlawn Memorial Park Cemetery.

Tuck was born on July 31, 1932 at Anselmo, NE, son of Thomas and Vera (Williams) Moroney.

He was raised on a farm near Anselmo, where he graduated from High School with the class of 1950.

Tuck entered the United States Army in April of 1953 and served during the Korean War until his honorable discharge in April of 1955. Following his service in the military, Tuck returned to farm near Anselmo. In 1967, Tuck moved to Grand Island where he was employed by Case New Holland until his retirement in 1990.

On February 16, 1974 Tuck was united in marriage to Earleen Jones. He was blessed with two step children, Patricia and Ronald.

Following his retirement from Case New Holland, Tuck worked at Jack Rabbit Run Golf Course during summer and enjoyed sharing Earleen's cookies with

his co-workers.

Tuck was a member at Blessed Sacrament Catholic Church, Knights of Columbus, the Platt Duetcher and the American Legion. He enjoyed camping with Earleen and going for drives to watch the cranes. Tuck was a devoted uncle and loved to spend time with his nephews and niece along with numerous extended family, friends and close neighbors.

He is survived by his wife, Earleen Moroney of Grand Island; brother, Roger (Shirley) Moroney of Colorado; step-grandchildren, Michael Sundeen and Kassie Gaddie; step-great-grandchildren, Kendra Sundeen and Josie Gaddie; nephews, Tom and Greg Moroney and niece, Natalie Waskowiak.

Tuck was preceded in death by his parents; stepdaughter, Patricia Sundeen; stepson, Ronald Gaddie; and brother, William Moroney.
