Veva M. Anderson, 97 of Grand Island died Wednesday, August 26, 2015 at the Brookefield Park in St. Paul.

Services will be 10:00 a.m. Monday at All Faiths Funeral Home. Daniel Naranjo will officiate. Burial will be at 2 p.m. Monday in Wyuka Cemetery at Lincoln.

Visitation will be an hour before service time.
