Virginia “Virgie” A. Bowman, 96, of Grand Island passed away on Monday, May 20, 2024 at her home at Primrose Retirement Community surrounded by family.

Following her official retirement, she worked part time at Livingston Sonderman Funeral Home Virginia volunteered at many places including: Saint Francis gift shop and at Third City Christian Church. She put her past experience in teaching to work to help others through the Connect program at the church where she enjoyed helping young children with their learning. Virginia was a member of the VFW and enjoyed playing cards with friends. She was also in the Bell Choir at Primrose.

Virginia was a wealth of knowledge and enjoyed any time with her family. She was steadfast in her faith and spent time in prayer, reading her Bible and bible studies.
